After 6 weeks of struggle, I rented a small office premises -about 200 sq. feet – and hired a fresher MSc IT student to work for me. Those moments very challenging and full of risk. With a family, a baby and now a developer, there were too many liabilities with me. However I trusted in God and gave it my best shot.


Today Atlas InfoTech is a full-fledged company and is now automated in its business processes. I say this not to show that I am a very hardworking person, but to admit and testify that the most normal person, when used by God, can become a success.

Friends, what I shared right now is no fairy tale, it is the real story of my own life, my own experience. Nothing is impossible. Life does not end with the minor failures that come from time to time. If we are willing to learn from those mistakes, completely surrender your life in the hand of God, He will take the responsibility of bringing your life back on track. CROSSFIRE - THE POWER OF GOD BEJINI SAJAN

The Gospel is the message of the Cross. Christ took our death consequences in order to give us His life. Jesus Christ gave His life as ransom for many. In the scriptures, Paul uses the word "cross" to refer to the "finished work" of God in Christ. Satan assumed that he was victorious as the cross signified to him that Jesus Christ was dead and he would no longer come back to save the mankind from his clutches. But everything changed as soon as Christ rose from the dead. For believers death isn't a scary thing. It truly means it is a way for the eternal life prepared for us. The power of the cross has done several wonders in many peoples' lives. All who believed in this power experienced the fire, the spiritual fire which led them into transforming to Jesus.

Today, I'd like to share one such testimony (which greatly moved my heart) of a great Olympian who was touched by this power of the Cross.

Charles Murray, an Olympic prospect and a very skilled high diver, was not raised in a Christian home and was struggling with God over some of the issues his roommate discussed about the forgiveness of sin and the saving power of the Cross. Everything about Jesus was a fascination to him and he began to ask questions about forgiveness and the Cross.

Finally one day when his friend asked him if he was ready to accept Christ as his saviour and Redeemer. His reply was a strong "NO". Over a period of time, Charles began to read the New Testament searching for the message on Salvation and the Cross and the forgiveness of sin with the help of his friend. However, he always carried this guilt on his face and seemed troubled. He was carrying this heavy heart with the burden of sin. Charles had special privileges at the University pool facilities as he as training for the Olympic Games. One evening he became especially restless and confused with his spiritual struggle and decided to spend some additional time practicing dives. Sometime between 10:30 and 11:00 PM he went to the pool. It was a clear night in October and the moon was big and bright. The University pool was housed under a ceiling of glass panes. The moon shone bright across the top of the wall in the pool area.

He believed that there was no need to turn on the pool lights because the glow of the moon filtered enough light into the building. Charles took the highest platform to take his first dive. At that moment the Spirit of God began to convict him of his sins. All the scripture he had read and all the occasions others witnessed to him about Christ flooded his mind. He stood on the platform backwards to make his dive, spread his arms to gather his balance, looked up to the wall, and saw his own shadow on the side of the pool building. The moonlight silhouetted his body projecting the shape of a cross on the stark, white wall. When he saw the cross, he could bear the burden of his sin no longer. His heart broke as he sat down on the platform and asked God to forgive him and save him. He trusted Jesus Christ on a twenty foot platform with only the walls of the building to hear his confession. Suddenly, a door opened and the lights of the pool area came on. One of the maintenance workers had come to check some work he had been doing on the pool. As Charles looked down from his platform he saw an empty pool, which had been drained for repairs. He had almost plummeted to his death, but the cross had stopped him from disaster.

Dear Readers – I'm sure this testimony would have changed you into believing that truly Christ shed his precious blood on the Cross and He has redeemed us of our sins. Once we believe Him and trust Him and confess our sins, He for sure would forgive us and would be our great refuge and strength.

GRACE MARKS TO GOLD MEDAL - PURE GRACE THE STORY OF HOW I CHOSE MY CAREER PATH

ROYSON RAJAN

Born in 1984, I did my schooling from St Xavier's Higher Secondary School, Mirzapur, Ahmedabad. I was an average student in the class, always getting first class grades in exams. My study policy was - study at school, play at home. I got 81% in my SSC exams and opted for Science Stream aiming to become an engineer one day. Everything was going good until in 2001 when I was in 11 standard – we all remember the earthquake that shook Ahmedabad. We were promoted to Std.12 with very little time to study. As if this was not enough, in 2002, during my 12 Standard the most violent riots took place in Ahmedabad.. I passed my HSC with grace marks in Physics and Chemistry.

With such terrible results all my hope of being an engineer was lost and I was praying that I should at least get a BSc admission. I took my admission in Bhavans College and those six months that I spent in travelling to and studying at Bhavans was a nightmare. Every morning when I stepped out of my house, I would be sad and depressed. My depression was at a peak and it was in that August that I decided to end my life. I gobbled some blood pressure tablets one night and went off to sleep. However the next morning I had my dad wake me up and I was shocked to see the day. My dad who sensed something fishy sat back with me and counseled me to his best. Luckily the next day I got a call letter from the engineering admissions authority. I had filled a form in the past, though I really had no hope. Based on my rank and my marks I was certain that I would never be able to get into engineering. I remember the date of my interview, it was same day my interim physics exam in Bhavans was to be held. I decided to take a bold step. Based on the last day admission status, there were no possibility I would get admission in an engineering degree, but there were some diploma seats in engineering available and Nirma Institute of Diploma Studies had 3 more seats vacant in the Computer Engineering field. I locked myself in a room and prayed to God. I said "God if you are truly God and if you can give me one genuine chance to correct myself, then this day give me admissions in Nirma." Computer Engineering has been always my field of interest.

So I decided to leave my physics paper and I went to LD engineering admission center. When my turn came, my physics exam time was over, there was no turning back for me and in front of me there was one seat available and I closed my eyes and handed over my certificates and documents to the officer, who allotted me the seat. The first day in college, I made up my choices, I decided if I got

this second chance, I wouldn't lose it. I started my daily lectures without missing any of my classes. Semester 1 results were out and I stood first. I think it was my third semester when CII had organized a show and Nirma students had a chance to go to the show. I was selected to go there and our principal Mr. Kannad Bandhopadyay called me along with others to his cabin. He gave us an outline about the show and asked us to go there and visit it. He opened his wallet and took out his business card and he was about to give it to us so that we could interact with business men in the show, but then he paused and said "Wait, why don't you guys make your own business cards, just design one in word file and take print, cut them and use them. Address yourself with your choicest titles." That day, I made a business card for myself as Mr. Royson Rajan, Future Entrepreneur and put my mobile number on it.



Every semester I stood first, got gold medals for outstanding performance and was placed in Adiance Technologies Pvt Ltd.

As I started my career, since I was a gold medalist in Diploma, I had chance to now opt for a Bachelor's degree. Under the Degree2Diploma scheme there was one seat available for a Nirma Diploma student to get into the Bachelor's program. Throughout my Diploma studies, I kept my focus on this seat. I got admitted to the Institute of Technology, Nirma University. Along with my studies, a US-based company named SoluSoft Technologies wanted to build its India presence and through a business meet, we got acquainted with each other and in 2005, I joined SoluSoft Technologies Pvt Ltd. Since the inception of their India operations, I helped them build their business presence in India. During my BTech studies, I would be in college from 8 am to 4 pm and from 5 pm to 11pm and sometimes till 1 in the morning I used to work for SoluSoft. It was very challenging and tough but I had my business card in my mind.

I finished my BTech studies from Nirma with 80% and continued working with SoluSoft. Now I was Vice President there and earning a decent salary. In 2010 I got married and considering the circumstances at that time, I had to part my ways with SoluSoft. At this point, I decided to incubate a company of my own and in November, 2011, I formed my own company and named it **Atlas InfoTech**.

One day, as I sat on the hospital bed and my dear husband was reading a portion from the Bible (2 Peter Chapter 1), the Lord spoke to me about the purpose of our life and His plans for me through a life of preparation and discipline. It was a step by step grand plan that He laid out before us with clear instructions to start His work. We were taken aback as we are too young and not qualified or experienced to handle such a mammoth project, but the Lord confirmed it through my husband. My husband was then into full-time ministry, taking care of a Bible School and Church. Further, the Lord sent a man of prayer and confirmed the same details of the projects that the Lord has shared with us in the hospital. We were witnessing the mighty and miraculous hand of God through these times. It was almost five months that I had not gone to office, my managers and colleagues were extremely supportive, but I realized it was time to quit and do what God had asked me to do. What greater opportunity would one get in a lifetime than to be recruited by the creator of life and universe himself! I quit my job in July 2013 and joined my husband in full time ministry. The day I took the decision to obey I was healed and never had to go back to the hospital. The Lord enabled us to start a ministry with a social and evangelistic outlook to empower communities with God's strength and love. Truly, there is no greater joy in life than finding the purpose of your life and living each day in the plan that God has designed for you - in God's garden and not the world's amusement park.

It our response to life's situations and experiences that make us the person we are today. You may have a difficult situation today - always know that it is your choice of response that steers you through. You have a choice to hear Jesus' voice and be with him in the garden or listen to the world and stay in the world's amusement park.

My Story, My Voice

J hope and pray that while reading this testimony, you be essentially encouraged, significantly challenged and greatly blessed.

I would like to share two learning's from some of my life events that have made me the person I am today.

- 1. God's voice is loudest in the silence of our pain.
- 2. Live in God's garden than the world's amusement park

I am one of those people who have had a perfect life, godly family and upbringing, good education, great friends, nice job, loving husband... yes – the perfect life!

My life mostly revolved around home, church, friends and work, things were simple and peaceful.



SISTER JUDY FRANKO Hyderabad

It all came falling apart in November 2012 when I was diagnosed with a tumour in the Pancreas and the doctors suggested I get it surgically removed. On further investigation we found that the Spleen was also affected by the tumour and it also has to be removed. In just a couple of weeks I figured that I am going to lose two vital organs and my life is not going to be the same again. We prayed fervently to the Lord to heal but did not hear from Him. We then decided to go with the surgery in March 2013 and the d-day came and underwent the procedure. It was a major surgery with a couple of days of intensive medical care. I still remember lying terrified on the operation table and looking at the huge lights over my head, in the midst of the medical buzz around me I saw a vivid pair of eyes look down at me that assured to be watching over me while I closed my eyes. That morning we read Psalms 121 – A promise to watch over me. The surgery went well and I rested for a couple of days at the hospital and was discharged.

After a week I started showing signs of weakness and the surgical drain fluid refused to stop, I was back in the hospital. The ordeal that followed after that was something we did not expect and that changed my life forever. It was not just a painful time for me but also for my family and friends. The doctors had no reason why the fluid did not stop, they tried multiple surgeries, procedures and tests to help but in vain. I was admitted five times in six months with around ten days each time and numerous visits for tests and examinations. Every doctor, nurse and ayah knew me by name. This was apparently the best hospital for such problems but we also consulted other doctors and hospitals and they had no answer either. Everyone had great theories on what could have possibly gone wrong but no clear solution to my situation. I had drastic weight loss, protein loss and morale loss. It was in this darkest hour that I heard the voice of my heavenly Father, I felt him close to me warm as a pillow and as real as an embrace. I had earlier experienced the love and communion of being with God but this was different, this was intimate and powerful. There would be times when I could not sleep or lie down because of the multiple pipes in my body through the sides and lungs; I would be pressed to read a portion from the Bible as if someone were compelling me to do so.

It was in these difficult times that my Lord taught me to hear His voice, pray in the spirit and interpret the word. All this while, I heard the word but did not see His heart, I worshipped but did see His face, I prayed but did not commune, this experience changed all that. It was like seeing my faith in Jesus in a new dimension with a whole new meaning and perspective. There were days and nights of pain through these months when I was not sure if I could see the next day. My body was weak but I knew through this my soul was being nourished. Truly I heard His voice when I lay quiet and listened to Him in the quietness of my pain.

3
